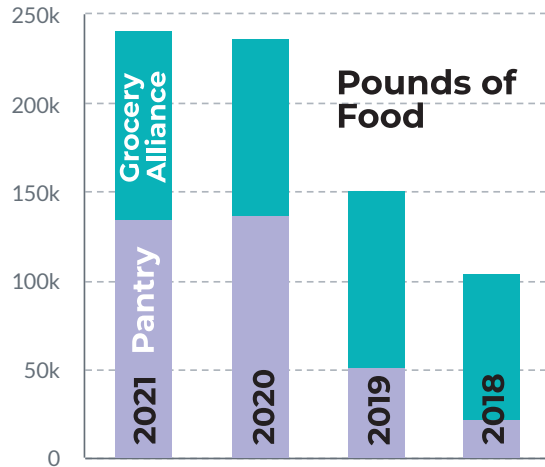

## WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD?

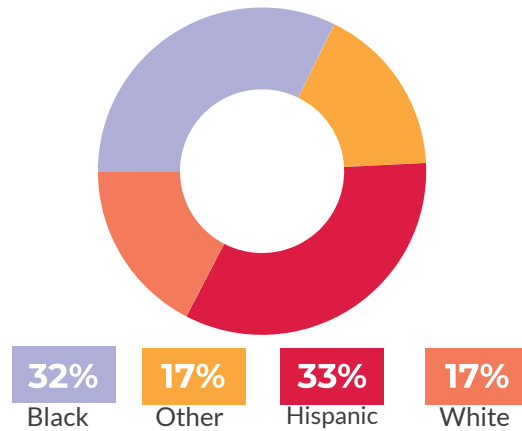
### FIGHTING HUNGER

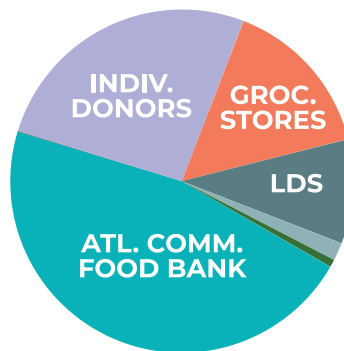

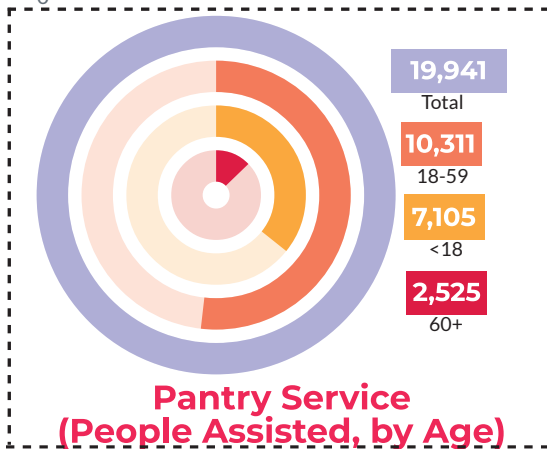

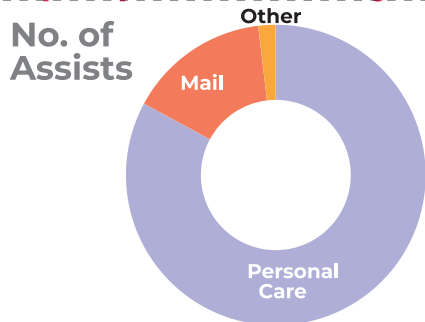
### WHERE'S THE FOOD COME FROM?

### PRESERVING HOMES

Our Financial Assistance helps families stay in warm, dry housing. Through rental and utility assistance, we help people retain their residences. For families with children already living "on the streets," we can provide short-term motel stays. In 2021, we provided almost \$180,000 in assistance.
